A 30 years old male, presented with limping, intermittent local pain and swelling in the left lower leg. The pain had been present about 2 years but the swelling has been obvious for only about 6 months. The patient denied history of any major fevers. Ten years before presentation, he had a right femoral fracture due to a motor vehicle accident and underwent surgery with a locked femoral nail which resulted in complete healing.

Physical examination revealed a tender tough immobile mass with a diameter of about 9 cm placed in the middle of the tibia.

Radiographs and Computed tomography "CT scans" were obtained. The thorax and abdomen where scanned for any primary or secondary lesions.
